This guide and the new country network website will list various types of events for each state, online events and also national events.


Each event is classified as a Country Network Member only event, a nonmembers welcome event or a public event.



Armidale

Northern Tablelands New South Wales

Armidale

British pastoralists first entered the region in the early 1830s, following the earlier exploration of the area by John Oxley. Oxley recommended the region for grazing, and soon squatters established large leaseholds in the locality. Armidale was initially founded in 1839 by George James MacDonald who was the Commissioner of Crown Lands and head of the local Border Police detachment in the New England district.



MacDonald established his barracks on the site and named it after Armadale on the Isle of Skye in Scotland which was the ancestral home of the MacDonald clan.





What I love about Armidale...The Armidale War Memorial Library is an ultra modern library which has excellent resources. Don't be fooled by the library's title; it stocks what most libraries stock, and furthermore has the latest IT devices, CDs, DVDs, and now includes a Podcast studio. Curtis Park in the middle of town is bounded by a shallow creek and has long stretches of walking trails to areas further afield. These trails are for cyclists' use too. There are several large grassed sporting fields for those who are feeling active. The Arboretum is situated above the town and affords a pleasant vista of Armidale's surroundings. There is a duckpond and an artificial waterfall to enhance the visit and there are barbecue facilities as well. It's a good place for relaxing and pondering where one is in life.

Where I wander... Besides strolling around town I like to drive to any of the 59 national parks around the region. It goes without saying that I haven't visited all of them, not even after nine years residency in Armidale. If you have limited time on your stay in New England, the Oxley Wild Rivers, the Dangar Falls and the Wollomombi Falls are not to be missed, especially after heavy rain! The latter is the highest waterfall in NSW, and second highest on our continent.

My favourite place to get a beer with friends is... My favourite places for a coffee are the Court House Café (outdoors) or the Armidale Bowling (indoors). At the former you can watch the good burghers of Armidale walking through the Mall, while in the bowling club, it's common to see women in groups with their noisy little ones exercising their lungs while I try to enjoy an extra hot cappuccino. For a decent, well cooked meal you cannot beat the Shua Hu Chinese Restaurant which is two kilometres beyond the CBD. The ingredients are fresh and tasty!

Northern Tablelands New South Wales

If I want to escape from the world for a little while I go to... My favourite place to escape is sitting on the train travelling to Tamworth for a day's excursion. Believe me, you would too if you had lived here for nine years! This must reveal something about the excitement or lack thereof, of living in Armidale, which lays claim to being a city, but is merely a country town.

What's the Vibe? What vibes? I haven't felt any since moving here! As far as I'm concerned I am the only gay in town. Armidale is very peaceful and the only busy places are the Woolies and Coles carparks and that's because people are behind the wheel of a car! Several intended initial meetings didn't even eventuate. Hence I joined Country Network and am happy about that!

Places of interest to a visitor include...:Such places of interest to show a visitor are mentioned above. Overall Armidale is worth a visit but there's no need to plan a lengthy stay, unless you can somehow make contact with a "friendly" man, and believe me, it's easier to find a needle in the proverbial haystack!

There are no big landmarks here, but if there were, it would have to be this........... a gigantic ?



Anyone who identifies as a man is welcome at Bent Couch Counselling, where they will find a supportive and therapeutic setting. Trail Information:

This month it's a picnic and swim with the option of a short walk. This will be about the warmest time for a swim in the creek, and not too hot for a walk.

We did this short walk last year and followed the walk with a 4x4 drive up to Bangalore Falls. February and March on the mid north coast of NSW being a bit warm and humid, this will be a short drive from the meeting point (details below) of 1.5 km to the Bindarray picnic area. There is a small creek crossing halfway, so probably best suited to 4x4 vehicles.

Car pooling: I suggest that those of us who are in the immediate Coffs Harbour area meet at the old Catholic Club on West High Street at 9.30am for a 10.00am start at the track.
